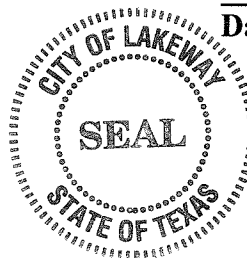



**CITY OF LAKEWAY CITY COUNCIL MEETING**  
**Action Minutes of Special Session**  
**Monday, May 28, 2014, 2:00 p.m.**  
**Lakeway City Hall, 1102 Lohmans Crossing Road, Lakeway, Texas**

1. **Establish Quorum and Call to Order.** Present: Mayor Pro Tem Phil Brown, Councilmembers Joe Bain, Sandy Cox, Dwight Haley, Jim Powell, and Dave Taylor. Absent: Mayor Dave DeOme.
2. **Pledge of Allegiance.**
3. **Discussion: Discuss Emergency order issued by Mayor DeOme on May 19, 2014, and staff implementation.**
  - Staff Report by Steve Jones, City Manager. City Manager Steve Jones provided councilmembers with information on potential water restrictions likely to go into effect early this summer. He explained that the Emergency Order, deferring landscape requirements and permits for the construction of swimming pools without evidence of an outside water source, was enacted to deal with the real possibility of not having water available for outdoor use. He also noted that deferred landscaping installation is not mandatory, and that the emergency order authorizes him, as city manager, to lift the order when water supplies are replenished.
  - Citizen participation – Ashley Stevens, 610 Sunfish, stated that he would like to see the City’s landscaping ordinance changed to include xeriscape, which he has petitioned the City Building Commission to allow at his new residence, so he can get his final certificate of occupancy. Janet Wright, 108 Vinca, a resident and business owner of outdoor living design, applauded the City for being proactive in addressing the current water situation but had some questions regarding exceptions to water restrictions; she was advised to redirect her questions to the water utilities. Tony Bennett, 2101 Lakeway Boulevard, asked if irrigating landscaping with non-potable water is allowed; after hearing that non-potable water is permissible for landscape irrigation, he stated that he would support restricting the use of non-potable water as well.
  - Council discussion – Councilmembers supported the emergency order in its effort to curtail water use; however, they requested advanced notification of any future orders prior to public distribution whenever possible, so they can be fully prepared to answer the public’s questions correctly.
